PA – 12.5% of which PP 9.4% Disadvantaged cohort's persistent absence has decreased by 13.0% from 41.9% in 2021/22, to 28.9% in 2022/23.

Disadvantaged pupils are given more opportunities to attend school trips, residential and after school clubs Whole school curriculum identifies experiences for children PP funding has supported families to access wider experiences.
