



Safeguarding within the Mill Hill curriculum

We have identified opportunities in the taught curriculum for children to learn about safeguarding. Our broad curriculum gives pupils opportunities to experience life in all its diversity, to acquire knowledge, understanding and skills that significantly impact on personal development, behaviour and welfare and equips every child with the knowledge and skills required for personal safeguarding. Our PSHE curriculum is based on the SCARF curriculum which covers a wide range of areas linked to Safeguarding as well as our RSE curriculum. Children will specifically look at work to keep themselves safe.

SCARF curriculum with specific topics to keep children safe

	<u>Specific topics</u>
<u>Year 1</u>	How our feelings can keep us safe Keeping healthy Medicine safety
<u>Year 2</u>	Safe and unsafe secrets Appropriate touch Medicine safety
<u>Year 3</u>	Managing risk Drugs and their risks Staying safe online
<u>Year 4</u>	Managing risk Understanding the norms of drug use (cigarette and alcohol use) Influences
<u>Year 5</u>	Managing risk, including staying safe online Norms around use of legal drugs (tobacco, alcohol)
<u>Year 6</u>	Emotional needs Staying safe online Drugs: norms and risks (including the law)

We are sensitive in our teaching and recognise that some more sensitive subjects need to be taught at an age appropriate level, or at a small group or 1:1 level. Throughout sessions children are encouraged to explore and challenge ideas and give their thoughts and feelings in a safe and non-judgmental way.

Examples of safeguarding opportunities which are planned into our curriculum

- Internet safety
- Bullying, including taking part in Anti-bullying week
- Drugs, alcohol and tobacco
- First aid and how to call emergency services
- Water and Fire safety
- Road safety – discussed as appropriate on school trips and outings, and Bikeability work in KS2.
- Relationships and sex education – there are statutory and non-statutory elements to learning about relationships and sex education.

External visitors are invited into school to discuss issues concerning safeguarding, this includes:

- Emergency services – Fire & Rescue Service and PCSO
- School nurse
- NSPCC pants day
- Bikeability
- RNLI
