This half term, Year 6 have been learning about World War I. This is the first half of their history work on the World Wars. After half term, they will continue their looking with a focus on World War II.

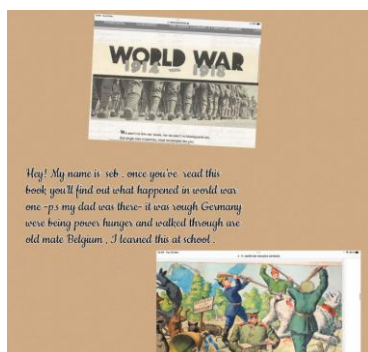
This has been a huge subject area; however, the Bats had been curious and have found out many interesting and devastating facts. Some of the children have even taught the teachers new facts!
