This half term, Rabbits have loved learning about their new topic, ancient Egyptians. In our English, we have been learning about the different artifacts and describing them in different ways.



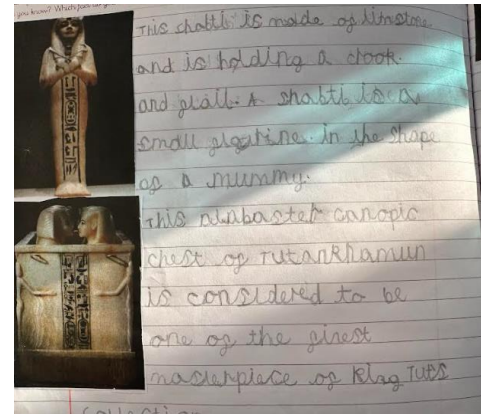
We have just started to learn about creating a museum guide, and even did a virtual tour of a museum, to try and find the ancient Egyptian artefacts we had previously learnt!
